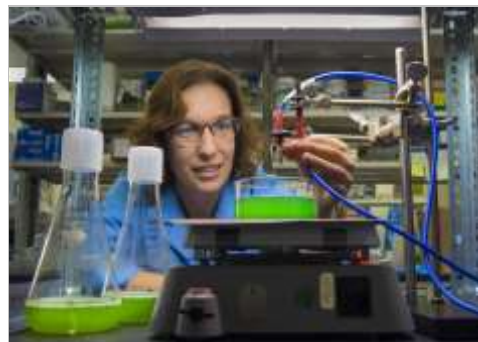

What is a CRADA?

- Cooperative Research and Development Agreement
- Agreement between a federal laboratory and one or more non-federal entities (NFE) (*including academia*)
- Stevenson-Wydler Act
- 2 types: Standard and Umbrella

Collaborators

Laboratories can collaborate with:

- Domestic and foreign companies
- Small and large companies
- Universities
- State institutions



Fairness of Opportunity must be satisfied prior to CRADA execution

Benefits

Funding

Create a new or supplemental funding stream to further technical work

Protection

- Protect intellectual property generated from collaborative research
- Protect NTESS from lawsuits
- ***MOUs are non-binding, NDAs are for discussion only***

Relationship Development

Support lab capabilities and further programmatic initiatives

The CRADA Participant benefits from over 70 years and billions of dollars of taxpayer funded R&D.

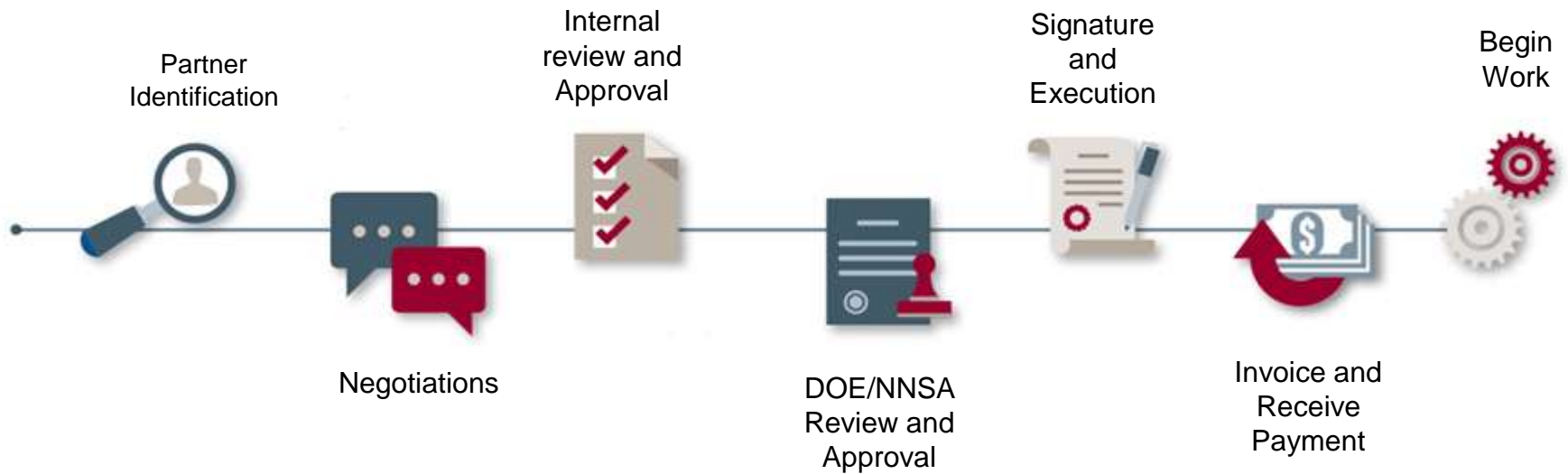
