

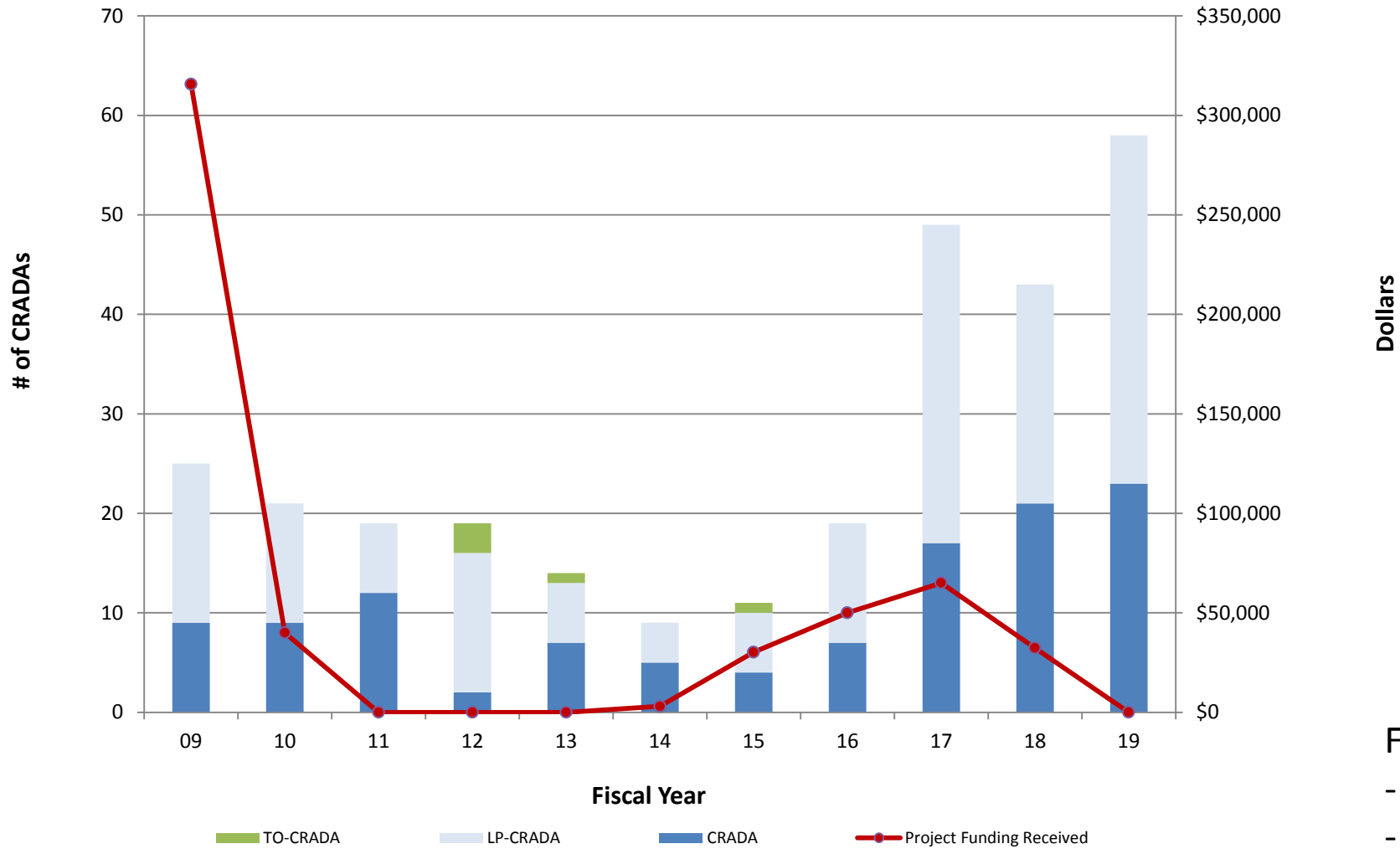

Limited Purpose CRADA (LP-CRADA)

15 USC 3710a

Description:

- PROVIDER has something RECIPIENT wants to evaluate or use for research, development, test, evaluation (RDTE), or engineering
- Protects intellectual property/proprietary information.
- Provides reasonable dissemination/delay of research results.

Why Use:

- For RDTE and engineering purposes when there is mutual interest in the results
- To determine if a CRADA, license, or procurement should be pursued

Bailment Agreement

Description:

- Industry loans equipment to NIWC Pacific for product test and trial or evaluation
- In best interest of NIWC Pacific
- An LP-CRADA or CRADA does not meet the need

Why use:

- Test or evaluation of a new or advanced model of equipment
- Test compatibility with other NIWC Pacific equipment or operations

LP-CRADA vs. Bailment Agreement

Inventions may result	Yes	No
Invention license and exclusive license option	Yes	No

LP-CRADA vs. Bailment Agreement (Part 2)

	LP-CRADA	Bailment Agreement
Who facilitates?	Tech Transfer Office	Contracting Office
Legal review?	Of course!	Absolutely!
Who signs?	Commanding Officer	Contracting Officer with appropriate authority

Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) 15 USC 3710a

Description:

- Allows parties to conduct specified R&D consistent with a lab's mission(s).
- Parties can contribute **facilities, equipment, knowledge, intellectual property and other resources**, but funds can only go from the non-Federal party to the Federal lab.

Why use:

- Enables sharing of **resources** and R&D costs.
- Protects intellectual property/proprietary information.
- Provides reasonable dissemination/delay of research results.

Education Partnership Agreement

10 USC 2194

Description:

- Encourages/enhances study in scientific disciplines at all levels of education.
- The focus is education, not collaboration.

Why use: A DoD Federal Lab may:

- **Loan or transfer equipment**, in support of the EPA
- Make personnel available to teach and develop science courses.
- Provide sabbaticals for faculty and internships for students.
- Involve faculty and students in projects.
- Develop programs for students to receive credit working on projects.
- Provide academic and career advice and assistance to students.

Commercial Service Agreement 10 USC 2539b

Description:

- Allows a DoD Federal Lab to make resources (**facilities, services, or equipment**) available through leases, contracts, or other arrangements. Such resources can not be in competition with the domestic private sector.

Why use:

- Provides non-Federal party with access to a **unique Federal lab resource** (for a fee).
